2. OBITUARIES

One minute silence was observed for those who passed away throughout this 12 month period.

President Jim Tuckerman addressed the Meeting:

Mr Jim Tuckerman stated that there had been a lot of excitement and interest in the last year, with a lot happening to drive the sport forward in New Zealand. 75% of clubs turnout at this years AGM was a great representation.

Mr Jim Tuckerman stated that next year the AGM weekend with seminars will hopefully be called a conference.

Mr Jim Tuckerman wished to thank all the Board members for their 100% support and asked that everyone put their hands together for them.

Mr Jim Tuckerman stated that he assumed everyone had read the President's report.

Mr Jim Tuckerman added that there had been a lot of change, following the HR Consultants restructure.

At this point Mr Jim Tuckerman wished to advise that Ms Vicky Simm was not present following an operation, however, was at home and doing well and wished to express his best wishes to her.

Mr Jim Tuckerman announced the change with the commission of Motocross and Road Race, instead of one commissioner, each commission is now made up of a selection of people.

Mr Jim Tuckerman acknowledged some of the highlights through the year.

- Progress Mr Paul Searancke assisted by Mr Dave Yardley, have made with Recreation & Leisure commission, working with government departments.
- There had been a roll-out of official training programme to officials.
- Commissions are working well with industry.
- Building good relations with FIM.
- Attended FIM conference in Geneva and thanked the Taupo Motorcycle Club for lifting the status of MNZ. He received great feedback of their hosting the World Junior MX Championship.
- Oceania went well.
- Changes with Motorcycling Australia's new President, Mr Stephen Foody.
- Thanks to Mrs Sandra Perry for her work with Asian Union, building better relationship with MNZ and Asia.
- Potential to host a MX1 & MX2 World Championship and a World Speedway GP at Bay of Plenty Speedway Park.

Mr Jim Tuckerman then advised he was continuing on with the confirmation of the minutes of the 91st AGM held 25th May 2009.

Mrs Sandra Perry commented that the AGM was out of sync with the agenda order.

3. Confirmation of Minutes of the last AGM

Mr Kevin Grey said that he did not find it clear, what concerned Jim Tuckerman about the minutes from the previous meeting?

Mr Jim Tuckerman used an example to demonstrate his concerns, that page 4, reference the CEO's report.

Mr Jim Tuckerman wanted to ensure that the minutes were an accurate reflection of the AGM.

Mr Gary Powell wanted to state that he was at the 91st AGM and was not an apology.

Mr Peter Ramage stated that reference to Shane, should have been Peter Ramage.

Ms Jannine Curnow also highlighted that Ms Bonnie McHardy was not present.

Ms Evelyn Robottom also highlighted that Dave Goodgame was present.

Mr Neil Ritchie commented that he would like it noted that he was pleased that a roll call was now being done.

Mrs Sandra Perry stated that she had raised her concerns with the minutes and had offered to see the draft minutes, as she was anxious to see what the concerns were.

Mr Jim Tuckerman stated that he wanted to review the minutes in the same sphere as they were written.

Mrs Sandra Perry said that Miss Vicky Simm should have seen the draft.

Mr Jim Tuckerman questioned again whether anyone had a concern with the minutes. Mrs Sandra Perry questioned whether there had been any serious concerns raised.

Mr Jim Tuckerman stated that at this point, he wished to add 3 names, Mr Neil Ritchie, Mr Paul Searancke and Bill Grice and wished to move that the records were a true and accurate reflection.

Mr Andy Scrivener stated that there is no record of discussion, remit or two third majority vote to remove the CEO position in last years minutes.

Mr Alan Chant questioned how there were so many inaccuracies when a professional minute taker was employed.

Mr Jim Tuckerman advised that they were using a new agency and that the minutes would hopefully be a true and accurate reflection.

Mr Jim Tuckerman asked for someone to move that the minutes of the 91st AGM be accepted.

Mr Dennis Phillips moved to accept the minutes of the 91st Annual General Meeting, seconded Mr Chris Costello

4. Consideration of the Annual Report of the Governance Board

Mr Jim Tuckerman called for any questions about the report and asked that the report be accepted.

Mr Errol Conaghan moved to accept the report seconded Mr Robert Grover

5. Consideration of the Audited Financial Statement of MNZ, and any related parties to balance date

Mr Jim Tuckerman addressed the 6 questions that were submitted.

- **CEO vehicle & restructure expense**

Response: Mr Jim Tuckerman is unable to disclose any details concerning employment contracts as per legal advice

- **National Road Race cost breakdown**

Response: Mr Paul Stewart addressed the question providing a summary of expenses.

- **Carnet cost**

Response: Mr Jim Tuckerman outlines that this was arranged for Te Puke Motorcycle Club and had been paid back.

- **Wages increase with a reduction of 2 staff**

Response: Mr Jim Tuckerman advises that this includes costs of restructure and holiday pays and the reduction would not show until 2010.

- **Presidents Pay**

Response: Mr Jim Tuckerman confirms that he is not on the payroll.

- **FIM costs**

Response:\$4076

Mr Jim Tuckerman calls for any further financial questions.

Mr Paul Searancke asks why the ISDE is still showing in the financial statements when it has already been wound up.

Mr Jim Tuckerman responded by stating that he had asked the accountant this and the accountant was unable to explain this and had not heard from the auditor. Mrs Nicola Stables had contacted the auditor and they don't have 2009, however do have 2006-8. This will be followed up on.

Mr Robyn Atkins moved, the Financial Statements be accepted seconded Mr Chris Costello

6. Appointing an Auditor and Voting Auditor

Mr Jim Tuckerman stated that he wished to appoint people to look at doing this job. He suggested that the Board do this.

Mr Errol Conaghan moved that the Board appoint an Auditor and Voting Auditor, seconded Mr Alan Hathaway

7. Announcing the result of the election of MNZ Officers for the ensuing term

Mr Jim Tuckerman congratulated Mr Dave Craig appointed Off Road South Island member uncontested and Mr Paul Stewart, appointed On Road North Island member uncontested.

8. Confirming from the Board of subscriptions for members for the ensuing year

Mr Jim Tuckerman stated that due to increase in costs, all licence fees would increase by \$10.00.

Mrs Sandra Perry questioned whether this would include GST since the increase on 1st October. Mr Jim Tuckerman confirmed that this increase was exclusive of GST.

Mr Paul Searancke suggested that this be put on the MNZ website with a description of what members get for their money?

Mrs Barbara Phillips asked would this mean an increase in one event licences?

Mr Jim Tuckerman confirmed that one event licences would remain the same then requested this be moved.

Mrs Barbara Phillips moved that one event licence cost would remain the same seconded, Mr Richard Managh

Carried

Mr Jim Tuckerman called for someone to move the \$10 increase for licences.

Mr Chris Costello moved that the \$10 increase in licences be accepted, seconded Mr Neil Ritchie.

9. Election of Honorary or Life Members

Mr Jim Tuckerman called for Mr Robyn Atkins to come forward and accept 'Life Member' status. Jim congratulated Robyn and acknowledges his years of service to the sport.

Mr Robyn Atkins accepted his 'Life Member' status, and with his love of motorcycling, looks forward to continuing his involvement.

Mr Jim Tuckerman calls for Mr Mike Pero to come forward and accept 'Patron' status for Motorcycling NZ. Acknowledges that the association will benefit the sport with Mike able to contribute in various ways.

Mr Mike Pero expressed his surprise and was deeply flattered and honoured. He stated that it was great to meet everyone last night and how well MNZ was run and recognised the professionalism in the room. He wished to congratulate the Board and everyone in MNZ.

Mr Neil Ritchie stated his own personal thanks to Robyn Atkins who he had first met in the 1970's at a conference and in the 1980's at various events. He wished to recognise Mr Robyn Atkins two sons, Greg & Darryl who have also done very well in the sport. He would like to personally congratulate Robyn and his family.

Mr Ray Shearman MNZM, also expressed his personal congratulations to Robyn and his family.

10. Special Business

Consideration of the Constitutional Remits

Remit 1 - 24

Mr Jim Tuckerman summarises that these remits refer to the CEO position, that this no longer exists.

Mr Jim Doherty moved the amendments to the constitution be accepted, seconded Mrs Evelyn Robottom

Mr Andy Scrivener stated that he thought that this went against the constitution and referred to clause 18, of the two thirds votes necessary to change the constitution and that the vote was now retrospective

Mr Jim Tuckerman confirmed that the HR Consultant had looked at what MNZ needed to do and taken the recommendation to reduce the headcount by 2 and disestablished the CEO and Administration Manager positions.

Mrs Sandra Perry stated that she thought Mr Andy Scrivener's concern was that the CEO position was actually in the constitution and the Board had removed it.

Mr Kevin Waugh questioned whether there had been a process to remove the CEO position.

Mr Errol Conaghan responded that restructure can be done under the authorisation that is given to the Board to 'manage the employment'.

Mr Andy Scrivener questioned whether the vacancy was redundant?

Mr Jim Tuckerman stated that the title was irrelevant and it was a General Manager Operations position.

Mr Kevin Grey said that there is a big difference between Office Manager and CEO and this would be a major change in the constitution.

Mr Jim Tuckerman confirmed that the CEO position had been disestablished and replaced by a more generic term for the future.

Mr Andy Scrivener stated that it was still retrospective.

Mr Jim Tuckerman replied that the change of words would be generic.

Mr Jim Tuckerman calls for a mover to accept the amendment – remit 1 to 24.

Mr Robyn Atkins moved to accept the amendments as listed in remits 1 through to 24 seconded Mr David Yardley

Remit 25

Mr Denis Phillips moves approval for proposed changes to voting seconded Mr Andrew Jones

Mr Denis Phillips explained that this sort of change calls for debate.

Mrs Sandra Perry agreed with Dennis and that she did not believe that this was the solution. She recommended that as this is a big issue, that it should not be voted on today. Mrs Sandra Perry stated that homework and the implications needed to be looked at and suggested a working group to find solutions and then vote. Mrs Sandra Perry also questioned whether there needs to be a discussion about the various methods of voting i.e. should every member have a vote? Mrs Sandra Perry thought that this would be very difficult.

Mr Jim Tuckerman thanked Mrs Sandra Perry and stated that the licence holders should look at this on the whole, so all 15 clubs should have the power to do what they choose. Mr Jim Tuckerman stated that the voting needs to be looked at according to the different clubs (i.e. classic and minis representing the young and old categories). Mr Jim Tuckerman suggested that this needed to be reviewed and work needed to be done. Mr Jim Tuckerman recommended voting on creating a standing committee. Mr Jim Tuckerman invited those present to chair the committee and who would like to be involved.

Mr Paul Searancke nominated himself, as did Mr Kevin Goddard, Mrs Barbara Phillips, Mrs Sandra Perry and Mr Dave Yardley.

Mr Terry Sparks moved that the working group be formed to look at future voting options, seconded Mr Bernie Harnett

Mr Kevin Grey asked a time frame be set for an outcome from this working group.

Mr Jim Tuckerman replied 1st December 2010

Mr Kevin Grey moved that the working group come up with an outcome by 1st December 2010, seconded Mr Paul Searancke

Carried

11. General Business

Mr Jim Tuckerman explained the difficulty to source funding for riders for 'Motocross of Nations' and other International events. Mr & Mrs Townley and Mr Scott Wilkins, the group who form the fundraising committee - pitched a fundraiser event 'Battle of the Clubs' which is to be hosted by Taupo MCC on the 29th May, the first initiative of the fundraising committee.

Mrs Sandra Perry objected that Bay Of Plenty is a listed competing club and two affiliated clubs missed out getting into the competition.

Mr Charles Colpman stated that Kapi Mana applied just after closing and told it was already full.

Mrs Carmen Davidson stated that she would follow up on what clubs would be competing and that there was a maximum of 20 clubs.

Mrs Evelyn Robottom questioned whether it had been specified who could be involved i.e. be an affiliated club.

Mr Errol Conaghan objected that this is not appropriate forum for this discussion to be debated.

Mr Jim Tuckerman handed over to Neil Ritchie to speak on behalf of Manawatu Orion Motorcycle Club.

Mr Neil Ritchie explained that Manawatu Orion Motorcycle Club is celebrating its centenary next year as well as Woodville GP 50 years. Neil outlined the ideas and events the Club has for their celebration and requests that Palmerston North be host to next years AGM.

Mr Jim Tuckerman stated that the Board had discussed the re-introduction of the 'unlicensed classes' – clarified as 'unlicenced' not 'one event licences'. There is a place for 'unlicenced riders' to join our sport, designed to provide the opportunity for introduction.

Mr Dennis Phillips informed that at the Secondary Schools Motocross event, hosted recently at Rotorua MCC – there were 130 unlicenced riders that required one event licences. There is a huge market out there that we are missing out on.

Mr Terry Sparks also supported encouraging non licenced riders.

Mr Murray Jensen suggested that 'unlicenced' & 'leisure' riders be incorporated.

Mr Paul Searancke stated that from a Recreation & Leisure side, there were issues with and reasons why this was not encouraged, one reason was with insurance.

Mrs Evelyn Robottom shared that this year's Magic Series hosted by Hawkes Bay Motorcycle Club sold all trail riders in the Novice Class, one event licences, to keep within the perimeters of the rules to protect the club.

Mr Kevin Grey stated that he liked the concept and the idea, but acknowledged the risk, which he felt needed to be considered. Mr Kevin Grey considered the internet as a good avenue to collate a wider database of people that it may appeal to.

Mr Allan Hathaway reminded that rule 15-10-3 allowing for 2 licence free rides allows for introduction for clubs. Possibility of unlicensed riders having 15 minutes or a specified number of laps non-competition.

Mrs Barbara Phillips stated that Rotorua Motorcycle Club has been advised by a lawyer on their committee that the one event licences do not cover anything as believed and again requested for consideration for the re-introduction of the unlicensed rider class. Rotorua is not charging the full one event licence fee, donating a portion to help with the cost.

Mrs Carmen Davidson moved that the Board look into the risks and legalities to report on the legal implications, seconded Mr Kevin Grey

Carried

Mr Chris Costello moved that the MNZ AGM be held at Palmerston North in 2011 seconded Paul Searancke

Carried

Mr Andy Scrivener questioned why the 'Conflict of interest' policy had been removed from the constitution.

Mr Jim Tuckerman responded that it had been removed as it duplicated what was already in the constitution.

Mr Kevin Goddard confirmed that the policy that was on the website included three pages of the current constitution, to include this, would be adding the constitution to the constitution.

Mr Errol Conaghan added that it was not general practise to attach policy to the constitution.

Mr Kevin Goddard stated that this was removed earlier as the Board felt it contradictory and conflict of terms to rule 5-1-2 of the constitution and stated a potential candidate needs to disclose prior to election, their areas of business that could be deemed a 'conflict of interest'. Contra to what members want.

Mr Kevin Grey asked if an inclusion could be created to satisfy the need to note a 'conflict of interest'.

Mr Kevin Goddard advised that a process already exists for registration of a 'conflict of interest'. Kevin went on to explain how this process works.

Mr Jim Tuckerman said that he would not be involved in anything which would be a 'conflict of interest'.

Mr Andrew Scrivener questioned why there are no Board minutes available for perusal having requested them on occasion and not received anything.

Mr Jim Tuckerman stated that minutes including discussion of employment and pay details are not for public viewing.

Mr Andy Scrivener then asked why complaints for 'code of conduct' had not yet been heard and what time limit is there?

Mr Jim Tuckerman stated that he would review and advise.

Mr Jim Doherty offered that Life Members are always available for guidance or discussion, that their interest still continues and they want to remain involved.

Mr Jim Tuckerman stated that the Life Members had a great deal to offer and had a great depth of knowledge and should be used more.

Mrs Sandra Perry asked the Board to consider that they write to Mr Kevin McCleary to return to MNZ as an act of good faith, as she felt his resignation should not have been accepted.

Mrs Sandra Perry moved, that Mr Kevin McCleary be re-instated as a Life Member seconded, Mr Tim Gibbes

Proposed Remit 26 – Carried over to General Business

Mrs Barbara Phillips stated she thought something should be done with regards to the expenses available to commissioners, some of which means that the commissioners are available from their employment. Mrs Barbara Phillips felt that there should be an expense account so they can be reimbursed for their time and financial commitment.

Mrs Sandra Perry supported Barbara's claim, adding that time involved for Murray Perry, as Safety Commissioner and the dealing with coroners in the instance of a fatality, can mount up to weeks.

Mr Paul Searancke stated that he does what he does as he enjoys it and wants to give something back to the sport and did not expect anything in return

Mr Dave Morris added that if pay was made for everything, there would be no money left.

Mr Chris Broadhead suggested that candidates should only consider taking on these roles if they have the time to put in.

Mrs Sandra Perry said that with a Safety budget of only \$3,000; maybe a review of the expenses budget would save over spending for things needed doing.

Mr Jim Tuckerman stated that he would review this.

Presentation of Trophies

Ken Duncan Memorial Trophy presented by Mr Jim Tuckerman to Taupo Motorcycle Club for; Best event 2009 – New Zealand Junior Motocross Championship & World Junior Motocross Championship

Mr Bryan Davidson accepted the trophy on behalf of Taupo Motorcycle Club

MNZ Initiative Technology Award presented by Mr Neil Ritchie to Te Puke Motorcycle Club for; Most improved club initiative in the organisation and hosting of the Endurocross event.

Mr Murray Jensen accepted the trophy on behalf of Te Puke Motorcycle Club.
